What is cuckooing?

Cuckooing is a form of crime in which drug dealers take over the home of a vulnerable person in order to use it as a base for drug dealing and illegal activities. They can use violence and drugs to control and intimidate people.

Who is at risk?

- People with substance misuse issues - past / present
- People with physical and or mental health problems
- People with learning difficulties
- People made vulnerable by living alone, or age
- Victims of Domestic abuse

Our Specialist Outreach Team provide:


- Experienced assertive outreach workers who support people in the most suitable environment
- Rapid response to support clients at immediate risk
- Brief intervention to re-engage people with services


What we offer:

- We help people build resilience to prevent future exploitation
- Our early intervention can help prevent risk of property closures
- Regular communication with referrers
- We attend professionals meetings
